	Any student or member of staff that has coronavirus, symptoms of coronavirus or has someone in their household who does, should not attend school. Anyone with symptoms should be tested and the outcome shared with school asap.
If possible, walk or cycle or go by car.	 On their allocated day, Year 10 and 12 students should walk or cycle to school and <u>arrive by 8.45 a.m.</u> or travel by car and <u>arrive after</u> <u>8.45 a.m.</u> -to be dropped off within walking distance. The bus park will <u>only</u> be open for buses. Students unable to do this can catch the DW coach service but must obey safe seating arrangements. Students must not gather in groups in the community before or after school. Staggered departure of students at the end of the day will be in place. There will be clear signage throughout the school buildings indicating 2M distancing. Students and staff must maintain this distance from one another
One way system in operation	 including when outdoors on their way to and from school. A clear one-way system will be in place throughout the school buildings. Students and staff must follow this system.
HUBS	Year 10 students will be divided into groups and attend school on different days (Monday – Wednesday) in order to reduce the number of students on site at any given time. On arrival each group will then be split into 2 'learning hubs' – blue and green whilst on site. Year 12 students will be invited to attend school on Thursdays and Fridays in small, socially distanced groups to receive specific A Level surgeries and teaching.
	In their learning hub Y10 students will be seated in groups of 9 , and be based in the same classroom and seat for all lessons. Desks will be positioned 2M apart . Break and lunchtime will also be in these classrooms in order to reduce mixing and to secure a protective 'bubble' for each group. Students should bring their own food and drink for the day as no catering will be provided at this point.
CATCH IT. BIN IT. KILL IT.	Students and staff will be asked to regularly wash their hands or use the provided hand sanitiser products. Tissues will be readily available in each classroom with bins with lids for disposal. Each learning hub will have a supervised toilet facility where appropriate hand washing will be managed.
	All classrooms will be thoroughly cleaned each day. All door handles and other 'touch surfaces' will be routinely cleaned throughout the day.
HEALTH	Staff will be available every day to support students who require additional help with mental health concerns . We are aware that many students will have found being away from school, their friends and staff very stressful.
