



## Governors Attendance

Governing Bodies are accountable to parents, the local community and the local authority – they are at the heart of how a school operates and how they undertake their role effects the interests of pupils, staff and the reputation of the school in the community

As part of Tupton Hall's governing body, our governors play a crucial part in ensuring high standards of achievement for all our young people. They help to set our school's vision, ethos and strategy; they hold the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and they oversee our financial performance to make sure our money is spent wisely and we achieve best value. As part of the statutory governance arrangements we record attendance at governing body meetings and sub-committees, but this does not provide a complete picture of our governors' involvement. As well as playing their part at these meetings, they visit and get to know the school, support our staff with specific projects and attend our school events. Many of them work or have other busy roles within the community, so we value the time they are able to give.
